As we reflect on 2024, CCLS is privileged to continue to serve over three hundred individuals throughout Wisconsin. We also continue to hold true to our mission of providing community support to individuals and enhance the dignity and rights of those who rely on others while seeking their own level of independence.

Over the past year, we asked the individuals we serve what they wanted to do in their communities, and so we responded-they went to the zoo, they bowled, they created artwork, they went to the movies and went on fishing excursions, and this is just to name a few of the fun activities.

As a nonprofit that provides residential services, we continued quality staffing in Adult Family Homes and Community Based Residential Facilities. We worked alongside the managed care organizations to improve the funding rates to address the services needed to support our work.

We held our first annual dueling pianos fundraising event and had over 100 people in attendance for an evening of food, great music, and raffle items. Our work around innovation included resurrecting the Creative Nursing Consulting program, providing nursing services to four outside agencies and training programs to eight external businesses outside our line of work.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

CCLS serves over 300 clients across Wisconsin in various supportive settings focused on individualized client centered care. Here are a few highlights from our programs in 2024!

Several of our day service clients attended classes at Mid-State Technical College in Stevens Point, and many attended their graduation ceremony in May.

Clients took classes in hospitality management, early childhood education, nursing, gardening, cooking, IT, painting, and pottery, as part of the Adaptive Career Awareness Series.





A Night to Remember

On Sunday, August 11th, the Special Needs Dream Team hosted their annual Special Prom at The Waterfront Cargill Room in La Crosse. Seven of our clients spent the day being pampered. Patty and the Dream Team members spent the year planning and organizing a magical experience for all.

The Beautiful Butterfly Project Prom helped fit all our clients in their dream prom dresses. The Riviera Salon donated their time and energy to make our clients look their very best with hair styling, make-up, and nail painting.

Clients danced the night away with music by DJ Brettly, and fun photo memories were made in the photo booth by Ever After.

FUNDRAISING HIGHLIGHTS

CCLS received three major grants in 2024. In May, an anonymous charity awarded CCLS a \$50,000 grant. The funds from this very generous donation are being used to help fund our Community Integration Program in La Crosse County.

Focus on Energy awarded CCLS a grant of \$15,216 to help us purchase a new high-efficiency HVAC Roof Top Unit (RTU) for our Watertown office. Focus on Energy estimates that the new RTU will save our organization more than \$1,000 per year in energy costs in the coming years.

Finally, CCLS received a grant of \$9,303 from the Beaver Dam Community Hospitals Foundation. This gift helped us implement a Community Garden project for our clients in Dodge County.

CCLS also hosted a dueling pianos fundraiser in October, which raised nearly \$13,000 in net income for CCLS!

Our 2024 Annual Fund Appeal mailing was also very successful. Our year end appeal generated over \$5,200 in net income for CCLS from dozens of individuals, organizations, and companies.

Thank you to all our donors for your generous support of our organization.

Dueling Pianos Fundraiser

On October 11, CCLS hosted a dueling pianos fundraiser at Wisconsin Brewing Company Park in Oconomowoc. A total of 118 people attended this fun event, including CCLS staff and board members, sponsor representatives, and many other supporters of our organization. Seventeen companies sponsored the event, which raised nearly \$13,000 for CCLS.

Event highlights included a basket raffle, games, CCLS video, introduction by Kathleen J. Roach, President and CEO of CCLS, and Dave Morstad, CCLS Board of Directors Chair, and a live performance by New Dueling Pianos.



CCLS INNOVATIVE SERVICES



Creative Nurse Consulting

Creative Nurse Consulting was created in 2023 to provide nurse delegation and services to outside organizations. CNC secured eight contracts in 2024 with gross earnings of \$11,000. Locations of service included Pewaukee, Sturgeon Bay, La Crosse, Onalaska, Lake Mills, Belleville, and Madison.

Nurse delegation services included a wide range of services from tube feeding to insulin injections and diabetes management. CNC also provided education on many topics, including Topical Creams, Powders, Inhalers, Nasal Spray, Eye Drops, Diabetes, Blood Glucose Monitoring, Patches (Fentanyl, Lidocaine), Narcotics, and Blood Pressure Checks.

Training

The Training Department is making great strides in expanding its course offerings, particularly with the new course on "Compassion, Fatigue and Provider Burnout." This topic is increasingly relevant as many professionals face these challenges in their work environment.

Additionally, we have been growing our client list and are being seen as a reliable backup when organizations' trainers are unavailable. This speaks to the quality and trustworthiness of the Training Department.



Fast Pace Medical Staffing

In 2024, Fast Pace Medical Staffing, Inc. (FPMS) experienced a challenging year marked by a shift in industry trends and increased competition. FPMS launched an automated self-scheduling platform, enhancing convenience and accessibility for both clients and healthcare professionals.

We also revised our business strategy to focus on higher-level professional contracts and per diem placements. This pivot included offering more competitive pay rates to attract and retain top talent in a tightening labor market.

Additionally, FPMS initiated the application process for GSA approval, aiming to expand our services to include staffing for VA hospitals, clinics, and other government healthcare facilities.

CCLS Senior Care Homes

In 2024, CCLS senior care homes were able able to increase resident involvement in activities. We conducted several community outings, which allowed residents to enjoy the State Fair, Christmas Lights, Folk Fair, and other events. The staff at Layton Court coordinated a Fall Festival, State Fair Day, and invited residents from all of our programs. Clarion Manor, Haven-Bayside and Rainbow Terrace each had state surveys conducted that resulted in no deficiencies.


